

The Seabrook Shawl

Materials:

Lion Brand Wool-Ease yarn in color #123, Seaspray (2 1/2 skeins). Each skein contains 3 oz/85 g/197 yds/180 m. You can substitute this yarn for any #4/worsted weight yarn that is either pure wool or contains some amount of wool.

US size 8/5.0 mm. straight knitting needles

One 2" button tree branch buttons

US size H/8/5.00 mm.

Darning/yarn needle

Shawl (Main Body):

CO 48

Row 1) (RS) *K3, P1, rep. from * to end.

Rows 2 and 4) Purl.

Row 3) Knit.

Row 5) K1, *P1, K3, rep. from *, end last repeat. K2.

Rows 6 and 8) Purl.

Row 7) Knit.

Repeat Rows 1-8 until piece measures 44".

Bind off, break yarn.

Shawl (Ends):

Join yarn at cast off end (short end of shawl) and with crochet hook, hdc in each st. across (48 hdc).

Buttonhole Row: Ch. 2, turn. Hdc in first 3 sts., ch. 3. Skip 3 sts., hdc in next 42 hdc. (45 hdc)

Ch. 2, turn, hdc in each st. across including the ch. 3 from previous row. (48 hdc)

Continue to ch. 2, turn and hdc in ea. st. across until crocheted edge measures 7.5".

Attach yarn at right side of right side of shawl and hdc across each st. (48hdc).

Ch. 2, turn, hdc in each st. across and continue in this manner until crocheted edge measures 7.5".

Now you will be working along the long sides of the shawl. Ch. 2, work 1 hdc in ea. st. along the long side of the shawl (approx.170 hdc). Repeat for other long side of the shawl. (approx. 170 hdc)

Finish off and weave in all loose ends.

Miscellaneous:

Block the finished shawl by getting it completely wet, squeezing out excess moisture and laying it flat on two towels. Using T-pins, pin down along all sides and allow to dry completely. Attach button to opposite side of button hole using a matching piece of yarn and the darning/yarn needle, approximately 9" up from the bottom and 3.5" in from the side.

Finished measurements: 15" wide and 56" long.
